

1. PURPOSE

- a. This memorandum sets forth policies and procedures agreed to by The Adjutant General, Department of Military Affairs State of Illinois (DMAIL), and the Illinois State Police (ISP) regarding Illinois National Guard support to law enforcement operations in the State of Illinois. This memorandum will facilitate implementation of appropriate sections of the National Defense Authorization Act, FY 1990, wherein Congress authorized funding for the National Guard to provide assistance in drug interdiction and eradication in support of national efforts to deter drug traffickers and improve the utilization of Federal resources.
- b. The parties agree that ISP requests for National Guard assistance may include multiagency, federal, state and local cooperative law enforcement efforts.


2. AUTHORITY

Section 112 of Title 32 USC gives the authority for the Illinois National Guard, in accordance with National Guard Regulation (NGR) 500-2/Air National Guard Instruction (ANGI) 10-801, dated 31 March 2000, to engage in law enforcement support operations.

11. LIABILITIES

- a. ISP will be liable for acts or omissions of ISP personnel that result in death, personal injury, or property damage/loss.
- b. Acts or omissions by National Guard personnel that result in death, personal injury, or property damage/loss, will be covered under the Federal Tort Claims Act.

12. RENEGOTIATION

This agreement will be renegotiated when laws, regulations and/or support requirements change in such a manner that the agreement cannot be executed (e.g., revocation of DOD approval for a particular mission). This agreement may be revised, in writing, by mutual consent of the parties.

13. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

This memorandum will be effective upon signature by both parties and will remain in effect until terminated by either party on 30 days written notice.
